Upcoming design workshops set for El Mar Drive Greenways Project

The **Town** and the **Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT)** will hold two workshops to seek input from residents and business owners about proposed conceptual designs for the **El Mar Drive Greenways Project**.

At the first workshop on **Thursday, Nov. 6 at 7PM** in **Jarvis Hall**, FDOT will present several alternatives for El Mar Drive and seek comments on the proposed designs. This project also includes the **State Road A1A** block between **Flamingo Drive** and **Pine Avenue**.

The second workshop, where FDOT will present updated concepts based on public comments made at the November meeting, is scheduled for **Monday, Dec. 8 at 7PM** in Jarvis Hall.

The Town urges all interested residents and business owners to attend the two workshops and comment on the proposals.

The state and the **Broward County Metropolitan Planning Organization** are interested in funding a multi-million dollar improvement project along El Mar Drive.

Town Commission lowers property tax rate

The **Town Commission** this year lowered the rate from **\$3.9312** per thousand dollars of assessed property value to **\$3.8000** when it adopted its **FY2014-15** budget on **September 29**.

The Town has the **third lowest tax rate** among Broward County's 31 cities. This means **you pay less taxes to the Town** than you would if you had a house worth the same amount in 28 other Broward cities. The residential fire assessment fee remained at **\$123.50** and is among the lowest in the county. The Town's sewer rates increased by **3.5 percent** in order to set aside funds for the eventual replacement of its pump station. Your **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** property taxes, which fund police, fire, emergency medical and other essential government services, account for less than 20 percent of your total tax bill. **Broward County** and the **Broward School District** eat up the lion's share of property taxes.

FPL upgrading power system in Town

Florida Power & Light is spending \$875,000 to upgrade their power system in LBTS to improve day-to-day electrical service and speed-up critical power restoration efforts after a hurricane or major storm.

The project involves replacing 110 wooden utility poles with concrete ones. The majority of poles are located between **West Tradewinds Avenue** and **El Mar Drive** from **Commercial Boulevard** south to **Palm Avenue**. While most of the work will be done south of **Commercial Boulevard** (see map at left), a number



of concrete poles will be replaced along **El Mar Drive** and **Bougainville Drive** just north of Commercial.

Work began in September and should be completed by January 2015, reports **David**



McDermitt, a senior communication specialist with FPL.

The power system upgrades will affect an estimated 2,000 residential and business customers, according to McDermitt.

The concrete poles stand 40-feet above the ground and weigh 7,500 pounds each. They are much stronger than wooden poles and much less likely to break or snap in high winds.

Once a new concrete pole is installed, it will take up to two weeks before the power lines can be transferred. Other utility lines, such as cable and phone lines, must be transferred to the new poles before the wooden poles can come down.

FPL said it will notify residents and business owners in advance if it needs to temporarily shut down power in an area.

McDermitt said the improvements in **Lauderdale-By-The-Sea** are part of an overall effort to upgrade its power system in South Florida. The estimated cost of the regional project is \$1.5 billion.

Commercial recycling helps LBTS businesses save money!

The **Town Commission** recently approved a contract with **Sunshine Recycling Services** to make it easier and more economical for businesses to start recycling programs.

While some businesses were recycling prior to the contract approval, others were inspired by the simplicity of the new **Commercial Recycling Program**.

Castle By The Sea Resort on State Road A1A (just across the street from the **Public Safety Complex**) was among the first under the new program to offer its guests the chance to recycle. A 12-room resort, Castle By The Sea used three carts for trash. It received a single recycling cart on Sept. 10, but needed a second one within a week. As a result, Castle By The Sea Resort owner **J.C. Ongania** dropped down to two trash carts, saving about **\$55 a month**. He anticipates dropping another trash cart and adding a third recycling cart for a total monthly savings of **\$105**.

How did Castle By The Sea do it? First, they set up a small recycling station in each room that included a separate container for recyclable items, the *LBTS Recycling Guide*, and recycling signage on the wall. Second, arriving guests were encouraged to recycle.

Visitors to the Town typically recycle at home so they are familiar with the practice. Given the means, they aren't adverse to recycling while on vacation. By offering recycling and encouraging guests to reuse linens to save energy and water, Castle By The Sea is doing its part to be a "Green" business in our community.

The next Town Topics will highlight some of the Town businesses that are long-time recyclers.

HOW IT WORKS

Commercial recycling remains an open-market and voluntary practice. Under the Town's new **Commercial Recycling Program**, the Town will provide the recycling cart. Sunshine Recycling Services will service the recycling cart(s). The business pays Sunshine \$15 for first cart and \$5 per additional cart. The Town will also provide copies of its Recycling Guide for guest rooms.

YARD WASTE CARTS AVAILABLE

RECYCLE RIGHT!

Soft plastics do not belong in your recycling cart! Plastic bags, cling or bubble wrap, cellophane or other soft plastic that do not hold their shape cannot be recycled. Soft plastics should be taken to your local supermarket or Walmart where there is a collection bin set up.

BugFest draws record number of divers

BugFest-By-The-Sea (July 25 - Aug. 2) was a great success and blessed with good weather this year. It attracted more than 300 scuba divers to Lauderdale-By-The-Sea. Divers **booked 24 hotel rooms** that we know of for a total of **69 room nights**.

BugFest was started in 2012 to promote Lauderdale-By-The-Sea's great beach diving to local and out-of-town divers. It is held in late July during the week in which **Florida's two-day lobster mini-season** occurs. Divers call spiny lobsters "bugs," which is where the name for the event originated.

BugFest this year included 23 separate events over a nine day period. In addition to various lobster hunting contests, BugFest included dive seminars, a one-day wreck diving workshop, the lobster chef competition, a photo contest, a reef clean-up, and a snorkel trip to the *SS Copenhagen* shipwreck. The latter was a new event funded by a cultural tourism grant from **VISIT Florida**.

BugFest kicked off with the opening night of the *Sinking World Art Exhibit* by Austrian photographer **Andreas Franke**, which was on display at the **Frame n' Art** store on Commercial Boulevard from late July through September. More than 250 people attended the reception.

Several hotels offered discounts to divers, including the **Beachside Village Resort, Castle-By-The-Sea, Driftwood Beach Club, High Noon, Santa Barbara, Tides Inn** and **Windjammer Resort**.

BugFest participation has increased steadily since it began. One hundred divers attended in 2012, 150 in 2013 and over

300 this year. More than 250 people also dined on delicious grilled lobster under a tent in **El Prado Park** on Friday, Aug. 1, when **Lenore Nolan-Ryan** hosted and catered BugFest's annual lobster cookout.

This year's BugFest sponsors included Reef Safe, a Daytona Beach sun care products company, Gold Coast Scuba and Deep Blue Divers, Lenore Nolan-Ryan Catering, South Florida Diving Headquarters in Pompano Beach, the Windjammer Resort, Beachside Village Resort and By The Sea Realty, which won the Master Lobster Chef competition. They are willing to help fund the project because they want to create a beautiful and functional greenway that provides a safe and comfortable pathway for pedestrians and bicyclists from **Hallandale Beach to Deerfield Beach**, the entire length of Broward County's 24-mile coastline.

The Town believes the state's greenway corridor proposal is consistent with what residents and business owners would like to see happen along El Mar Drive:

- ◆ Improved safety for pedestrians.
- ◆ Improved safety for bike riders.
- ◆ Wider sidewalks.
- ◆ Better lighting.
- ◆ More landscaping.
- ◆ Improved drainage to alleviate flooding.

This year's All Funds Budget reflects a continued commitment to upgrade the Town's infrastructure and overall aesthetic appearance. It includes funding for:

- ◆ **Public restrooms** in the Town for beach-goers on El Mar Drive just south of **Anglin's Square**.
- ◆ Drainage projects on **Basin Drive** and **Pine Avenue**.
- ◆ Streetscape renovations on Commercial between State Road A1A and Seagrape Drive. This includes aligning the roadway just east and west of A1A, widening the sidewalks, and moving landscaping from the median to the sidewalks.

Dramatic changes at Seagrape Commons

The **Seagrape Commons** building -- located on the southeast corner of **Commercial Boulevard** and **Seagrape Drive** -- has undergone a dramatic transformation and is now home to a number of new retail businesses that will enliven pedestrian activity in that section of Commercial Boulevard.

The extensive renovations, made by the building's owner, **Anthony Lomascolo**, highlighted the **mid-century modern architectural features** of the building in recognition of the building's innate design and the Town's design guidelines.

"It was a massive undertaking," said Lomascolo, who also undertook the renovation of the **Hotel Seacrest** on **Bougainville Drive** last year, and built the Caribbean-style townhomes that run from South Bougainville to Seagrape Drive several years ago. "The job is not finished but will be within the next few months."

Seagrape Commons, which features the Town's name and a distinct clock tower, is home to the **Town's newest restaurant**, Gran Forno's Pronto Café, an authentic Italian eatery and source of artisan breads and pastries. Several other new businesses, including **Dr. Juice**, **Fabric Works by Yvonne**, and **Spa Bar** have also opened in the building.

Coming soon are **Pump Sushi**, a new Sushi-Thai restaurant coming from the folks at the **Village Grille**, and **Coast**, an upscale and affordable boutique featuring nautical-themed merchandise, accessories and works created by local artists.

"There's no shortage of diversity in the complex," said Lomascolo.

"I always ask before beginning a new project, 'What is needed to enhance the Town, its residents and patrons?'" Lomascolo said. "If the answer is clear, feasible and justified

as a long term goal, I give it my all, down to minute details to ensure its success."

Three of the building's established tenants before the renovations began are the popular **Basilic Vietnamese Grill**, the **Dance Moves** studio, and **Argenti Designer Jewelers**. Argenti's owner is **LBTS Chamber President Mark Silver** who said, "Anthony has redefined the design of a whole city block on the south side of Commercial. With his perception and vision of architectural and interior design he has created a landmark block in Lauderdale-By-The-Sea."
